Headteacher's New Years' Letter to Parents

Dear Parents / Carers.

Firstly, I'd like to take this opportunity to wish you, your families and loved ones, a very happy new year and I am writing to provide a number of notices and updates ahead of our new term which starts for students tomorrow.

2022 was a year that saw our first full academic 'return to norm' and was a real test of stamina for students but I am so proud of how Woodrush students displayed true grit, resilience and maintained an eagerness to learn and challenge. Autumn saw many exciting developments at Woodrush, such as within Sixth Form, and culminated in some fantastic celebratory events which showcased the many talents and achievements students have within our school. Governance & Leadership

I am delighted to announce that the Governing Body appointed, Professor Stuart Brand – formerly Director of Learning Experience across Birmingham City University, to fulfil the position of Chair of Governors towards the end of last term. Thank you to all students and families for their kind donations for our Food Bank. This has really made a difference to families in our community. And we managed to raise a fantastic total of £1078.71 for Children In Need, £546.61 for Save the Children thanks to our Christmas Jumper Day and a total of £521.06 for Macmillan Cancer Research last term. Thank you for your kind generosity.

All this, at a time of continued financial hardship that many families and members of our community are facing which is making home and working life especially challenging for many people. With this in mind, we want every student to receive their entitlements to free school meals and additional educational funds where possible. If your circumstances have changed, or to check whether your child could be eligible for Free School Meals and Pupil Premium funding, please contact the school and speak to Mrs Beddoes on 01564 823777 or email her directly on <u>sbeddoes@woodrush.org</u>. Everything you say will be treated in the strictest confidence and you will be provided with a short form to complete so we can check if you are in receipt of a qualifying benefit. You can apply at any time, and we will contact you with more information once your application has been accepted. For all students, our bagel breakfast club will continue to serve daily free bagels and jams for all students each morning before 08.30am line-up.

We record and follow-up lateness unless parents can communicate exceptional circumstances for that day. Please continue to support our punctuality drive and ensure your child is through our school gates for 08.30am (08.50am on Wednesdays) which ensure they are lined up for tutors at 08.35am (08.55am on Wednesdays).

- Smart, Appropriate & Prepared

Uniform also continues to be a real strength of Woodrush and I would like to praise our students for looking so smart when in school. Standards could easily slip if we become complacent, so, please ensure you support your child in bringing appropriate school uniform. With coats for the cold and wet weather so they can remain comfortable for learning throughout the latter half of this winter season. Likewise, please ensure you support you child with stationery items each day so they are equipped to learn.
